Friends & Relatives, 2019

The year started when the 116th congress, with a democratic majority in the House of Representatives, convened in January. Donald Trump became the first U.S. president to visit North Korea when he walked across the Demilitarized Zone for a peace summit. And, ISIS was eradicated in Syria and Iraq.

The Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris was nearly destroyed when it burned. Two Boeing 737-MAX planes crashed within months of each other; soon afterward the fleet was grounded. Hurricane Dorian hit the Bahamas with winds of 185 mph. A 75' scuba diving boat, the *Conception*, caught fire and sank while anchored off the coast of Santa Barbara; 34 people died making it the worst maritime disaster in the state since 1865.

We're on the brink of a data & communications revolution enabled by 5th generation mobile phones and the "Internet of Things". You see the beginning of this in computer based connected cars, video doorbells, wearable fitness devices, smart thermostats, and household digital assistants (Alexa & Siri) that work seamlessly with each other, cell phones, and big brother. Eventually smart mattresses will track sleep, medical implants will monitor heartbeats, and vending machines will request refills when needed.

California continued its collapse. While only 12% of the nations' population live here, we have 47% of the homeless. Exaggerating the problem, politicians have decriminalized theft and legalized drugs; San Francisco has 70 car break-ins every day and shop lifters receive a courtesy summons to court instead of being charged with a crime. Third World diseases such as Typhus and Hepatitis are resurgent while syringes handed out to addicts by liberal bureaucrats wash up on sandy beaches. With no political opposition and no accountability democratic lawmakers have ruined our once majestic cities and much of the state.

Astronomers discovered a planet with water in its atmosphere (K2-18b) 110 light years away and scientists took the first ever picture of a <u>black hole</u> located at the center of the M87 galaxy. China, India, and a private <u>Israeli company</u> all sent probes to the moon; some were successful, others not. SpaceX flew its <u>Dragon</u> capsule, capable of carrying astronauts, for the first time during a supply mission to the International Space Station. The renewed interest in space is invigorating and personifies the pioneering spirit that typically changes the course of history. The United States will return to the moon in 2024 with the "<u>Artemis</u>" missions (named for the Greek goddess and twin sister of Apollo). The first woman is slated to walk on the lunar surface and we'll establish a permanent base there. 571 human beings have been in space but only 12 have set foot on the moon (all of whom were American). Meanwhile, the Andromeda Galaxy and Milky Way galaxy (where we live) will collide in the distant future. If you were to look at the night sky 4 billion years from now, this is what you'd see:

Theresa May was forced out as prime minister of England after she failed to implement Brexit. Boris Johnson, a conservative, was elected to succeed her in two separate votes where Mr. Johnson and his party won by a landslide. Britain is finally on course to leave the European Union, which will likely happen in 2020.

ARAMCO, an Arabian oil company owned by the Saudi royal family, sold shares on a stock exchange for the first time. With annual revenues of \$110 billion and valued at \$2 trillion ARAMCO is worth more than Apple, Google, and Exxon-Mobile combined. In the meantime, the White House is negotiating with China on import tariffs. These tariffs are as much about discouraging Chinese theft of American intellectual property (i.e. patents), which undermines the U.S. economy, as they are about fair and balanced trade.

The leader of ISIS, <u>Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi</u>, was killed in a U.S. special forces operation when he detonated a suicide bomb with his young children by his side. The Washington Post ran an outrageous <u>headline</u> that referred to al-Baghdadi as an "austere religious scholar".

Nine American women & children were shot point blank and killed when a Mexican cartel attacked their caravan as they traveled to a wedding near the U.S. border. Encouraging illegal immigration and demands for an open border, which most democratic politicians now support, poses a clear and present danger to our country. Illegal aliens (who cost U.S. taxpayers \$115 billion every year) are released from jail, as required by sanctuary state laws, to prey on Americans. It is telling that only 20% of Hispanics support "catch and release" of families who cross our borders illegally.

A million people in Hong Kong protested against China's oppressive government. As a result of the Opium Wars the tiny island nation was leased to the British for 99 years. When the lease expired in 1997 China agreed that the territory would remain autonomous for 50 years. It now seems unlikely that China will honor that agreement. While Antifa radicals preached "resistance", attacked bystanders on the West Coast, and called for abolishing capitalism and our democracy, protesters in Hong Kong, faced with real tyranny, waved American flags.

The International Atomic Energy Agency announced that <u>Iran breached the limit</u> on its stockpile of enriched uranium. The rogue nation seized two British oil tankers and shot down a surveillance drone over international waters. For 40 years now the country has been the world's largest state sponsor of terrorism. U.S. sanctions and a generation of Persians born long after the violent Islamic revolt of 1979 provide the seeds of a revolution that has the first real chance of changing the country since my family left Tehran.


Climate change activists say the Earth will soon be uninhabitable. But they've been saying that for 50 years now:


World fossil carbon dioxide emission 1970-2018
